Highpower Rifle Intermediate Clinic

CLINIC OBJECTIVE

The Wildcat Intermediate Highpower Clinic is a program designed to provide follow-on training after the Beginners clinic. This training assumes the student is experienced in NRA Highpower matches, at least enough to be classified. It is mainly aimed at Marksman, Sharpshooter and Expert classes. As a result of this training, the experienced shooter will be able to effectively develop match grade loads, understand the intricacies of effective sling use, develop sight and zero procedures, and develop sound position fundamentals to build upon. More importantly, the student will develop effective practice routines allowing further progression after the clinic.

CLINIC DESCRIPTION

The Clinic is conducted by a team of highly qualified High Master, Master and Distinguished Riflemen, augmented by numerous other volunteer rifle competitors. The training emphasizes Range & Firearms Safety, Service Rifle and Match Rifle fundamentals, and sound position building. The training includes classroom instruction and live-fire instruction with coaches.

RAIN / ALTERNATE DATES

In the event of a weather cancellation, a make-up day will be scheduled and posted on the Highpower page of the Wildcat Valley R&P Club website, www.wvrpc.org. If traveling, be sure to check the website the night before the clinic.

ELIGIBILITY

This event is open to the public and is structured towards someone with an NRA classification. High Power Rifle competition is a sport requiring some stamina and physical flexibility. All participants should be in good health and in reasonably good physical condition, be able to assume prone and sitting positions for sustained periods, and will be required to walk to the target pits and operate moving targets. Youth shooters must be at least 14 years old and able to handle a 14 pound AR-15 in a safe manner.

REGISTRATION & FEES

Advanced registration is not required; however range capacity is 40 shooters. Fees are \$10 for adults and \$5 for youth. All youth under the age of 18 must be accompanied by a parent or adult sponsor.

RIFLES & AMMUNITION USED FOR THE CLINIC

- This training is structured around the U.S. Service Rifles (M1, M14, & M16) and their commercial equivalents (M1, M1A, & AR-15), and NRA Match Rifles.
- Students should bring their own equipment and at least 100 rounds of match-grade ammunition.

CERTIFICATES OF TRAINING

A certificate of training will be issued to each student that completes the clinic. A certificate of training, issued by a CMP authorized clinic, fulfills one of the requirements for the purchase of U.S. Army surplus rifles from the CMP.

EQUIPMENT & CLOTHING

Hearing and eye protection are mandatory for the firing phase and pit duty. Students should have a full complement of normal match gear, including at least magazines, ground mat, spotting scope, shooting jacket or heavy sweatshirt, sling and a mitt or glove. Students should wear appropriate outdoor clothing to include; warm clothing, sweaters, sweat shirts, denim or heavy cloth trousers (no shorts), boots, hats and rain gear. Students should bring a Highpower Databook, or notebook and pen. Students are also encouraged to bring bug spray and sun block. There will be no food or beverages available, so please prepare accordingly. Students are encouraged to bring water and at least a light snack.
